## SECTION 4. FIRST-AID MEASURES

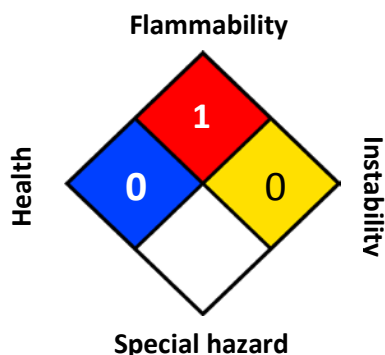
